## Blomidon Provincial Park Trail System

Blomidon Provincial Park is renowned for its spectacular views. Blomidon's 759 ha (1,875 acres) include 180 m (600 ft.) high cliffs, a variety of habitats, striking natural features, abundant wildlife -- and the world's highest tides wash its shores.

These natural attractions provide excellent opportunities for camping, hiking, beach-combing, photography or just appreciating nature.

**In case of an emergency, notify park staff or call 911. The park address is 3138 Pereau Rd. If an evacuation is necessary, follow staff directions.**

### Park Rules and Regulations

To ensure everyone has a pleasant stay, please note the following:

Fires are permitted only in the provided grills. No other open fires are permitted in the park.

Pets must be kept on a 2 m (6 ft.) or shorter leash. Owners must clean up after their pets.

Hunting, trapping or carrying firearms within the park is prohibited.

Alcoholic beverages may only be consumed in residence (tent, trailer etc.) at a registered campsite. All laws respecting alcohol consumption will be strictly enforced.

Removing or defacing any park structures or signs, or any natural features such as plants or trees is not permitted.

Advertising or operation of any business is not allowed.

Obey all traffic signs. The speed limit is 25 km/hr (15 mph) unless otherwise stated.

The Parks Act & Regulations are in force at all times. A copy is posted at the Park Office for your reference. Failure to comply with the regulations may result in your being asked to leave the park.

### Tips for a Safe Visit

#### **Be Prepared**

Hikers should be physically fit. Comfortable hiking boots or other sturdy footwear is recommended. Carry a first aid kit. Cell phones will work in most areas of the park.

#### **Be Careful**

The tide comes in very quickly. Check with staff for tide times before walking along the beach. Approach cliffs only at designated viewing areas. The cliff line is constantly eroding and may be unstable. Stay behind the protective fencing. Obey all signs.

#### **Respect The Environment**

Pack out all garbage. Most trash can be eliminated by packing food in plastic bags instead of cans, foil and bottles. Do not put garbage in the outhouses. Toilets tend to be situated only near the trail heads. Plan accordingly.

#### **Wildlife in Blomidon Park**

The most common animals found along the trails are deer, snowshoe hare, porcupines, squirrels, partridge, fox, raccoons and skunks. During the winter, coyotes are sometimes seen. Various species of birds occupy the park according to season.
